

JANUARY 2010 NBC NEWS/ *WALL STREET JOURNAL* POLL

The poll results are from a survey conducted by the polling organizations of Peter D. Hart and Bill McInturff for NBC News and *The Wall Street Journal* from January 23 to 25, 2010. The survey was conducted by telephone among a cross section of 800 adults (including a sample of 83 interviews among adults who only use a cell phone).

The national sample for this poll was drawn in the following manner: Individuals were selected proportionate to the nation's population in accordance with a probability sample design that gives all landline telephone numbers (both listed and unlisted) an equal chance to be included. Adults, age 18 years old or over were selected by a systematic procedure to provide a balance of respondents by sex. The cell phone sample was drawn from a list of cell phone users nationally, and respondents were screened to ensure that their cell phone is their only phone.

The data's margin of error is ± 3.5 percentage points for 800 adults at the 95% confidence level (± 3.8 for Q7a, Q7b, and Q7c which was asked only of registered voters). Sample tolerances for subgroups are larger. Minimal weights have been applied to sex, race, and age.

The data reported here are the property of NBC News and *The Wall Street Journal*, who must be credited whenever these results are cited.
